

## Short Curriculum - **António Carvalho Maneira**

António Carvalho Maneira is an Assistant Professor at IADE— Faculty of Design, Technology and Communication of the European University, Lisbon, Portugal, where he teaches Information Visualization and coordinates the Master's Degree in Communication and Multimedia and the Bachelor's Degree in Visual Design, both delivered in online open distance learning.

He has worked as a professor since 2014, starting at the University of Beira Interior, Portugal, teaching in several areas of communication, design, and multimedia. He has collaborated as a Visiting Academic at the University of Saint Joseph in Macau since 2017 in the former Faculty of Social Sciences and Education, current School of Education, and the Faculty of Arts and Humanities. He collaborated in 2019, 2020 and 2021 on an educational project to support learning mathematics using Khan Academy in partnership with Altice, Educom and DGE. In 2021, he collaborated with a digital literacy project, PICCLE, developed with *Plano Nacional de Leitura* in Portugal (Reading National Plan) supported by DGE. He has participated in several other projects related to digital technologies, multimedia, and audiovisuals in education, and he has over 20 years of experience in this area, participating in several training, outreach, and media production projects. He was awarded his PhD 2014 in Digital Media: Audiovisual and Interactive Content Development from the Nova University of Lisbon in collaboration with the University of Texas at Austin. He holds a master's degree in Communication Sciences, Audiovisual, Multimedia and Interactivity from the Nova University of Lisbon with a thesis on e-learning design. He graduated in Communication Design in 2003 from the University of Lisbon.

He is an editor of the EFT Journal—Education, Training, and Technologies and was invited to the Scientific Committee of HCII 2024, ARTECH 2021/23, and DIGICOM. He participated in the organization committee of several national conferences in Portugal, namely TIC@Portugal, which gathers a community of hundreds of teachers yearly in a hybrid model conference with distributed meeting rooms from the north to the south of Portugal. He has successfully supervised seven master's degree projects.
